#### **RECOMMENDATION (MOTION):**

THAT the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board authorizes the payment of \$724.71 (\$641.34 + 83.37HST) from the Detachment Board's 2025 Budget for the 2025 Membership Fee in the Ontario Association of Police Services Boards (OAPSB).

#### **PURPOSE:**

The Purpose of this report is for the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board to authorize payment of the 2025 OAPSB Membership from the 2025 Detachment Board's budget.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In order to provide training, information and guidance on implementation of the *Community Safety and Policing Act*, in March of 2024, the Municipality of Sioux Lookout paid for a membership in the Ontario Association of Police Services Boards (OAPSB). The membership has proven to be invaluable in terms of training, webinars, information, and even one-on-one information sessions for staff working on implementation of the *Act* and the transition from Police Services Boards in Pickle Lake and Sioux Lookout to the new Detachment Board structure.

The membership fee paid in 2024 was \$1,829.22 (including HST), based on the size of the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment police force.

#### DISCUSSION:

OAPSB has changed its formula for determining Membership Fees for Municipal Police Service Boards/First Nations Boards and OPP Detachment Boards. Staff was not aware of how the new formula would affect fees and assumed there would be an increase; therefore, \$2,000 was budgeted in the DB's 2025 budget.

Membership Fees for Municipal PSBs (municipalities with their own police forces) and First Nations Boards (First Nations with their own police forces) is based on the size of the force. OPP Detachment Board fees are based on the number of properties in the municipality(ies) being served, possibly to be more aligned with how actual policing costs are determined.

We have received the invoice for the 2025 Membership Fee. The fee is \$641.34 + \$83.37HST for a total of \$724.71, significantly under what was budgeted. We believe the fee is based on 3,054 properties in Sioux Lookout, possibly because Sioux Lookout is the larger of the two municipalities comprising the Board.

Staff is recommending that the \$724.71 that the fee be paid out of the 2025 Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board budget so that the resources of OAPSB can continue to be available to staff and the Board.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT the Sioux Lookout Detachment Board approves, adopts and implements the following REVISED Rules and Procedures as presented/amended at the November 28, 2024, Detachment Board Meeting:

- Complaints . . .
- Conflict of Interest (and Disclosure of Misconduct)
- Virtual Meetings . . .

**PURPOSE:** For the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board to receive, review, approve and adopt three revised Procedures.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Section 46 of the Community Safety and Policing Act requires that detachment boards adopt "Rules and Procedures". These are "inward-looking" procedures that specify how the Board is going to operate.

At its August 8, 2024, meeting, the Board approved a large number of "Rules and Procedures" to govern its operation.

It is also anticipated and more Procedures will be required in the future.

#### DISCUSSION:

Three of the Procedures that were approved on August 8 have had to be revised. They are as follows:

 Complaints – Additional information and clarification about the complaints processes set out in the CSPA was received through "Advisory Bulletins" from the Inspectorate of Policing; therefore, significant revisions were required to the "Complaints" Procedure that was presented to and approved by the Board at its August 8 meeting. The significantly revised and detailed version is attached.

- Disclosure of Misconduct (and Conflict of Interest) Additional information and clarification of the "Disclosure of Misconduct" process set out in the CSPA was also received through "Advisory Bulletins" from the Inspectorate of Policing; therefore, revisions were required to the "Conflict of Interest" Procedures that was presented to and approved by the Board at its August 8 meeting. The revised version is attached with the major change highlighted in yellow.
- Virtual Meetings The Procedure presented to and approved by the Board at its August 8 meeting did not address how "Closed Meetings/Sessions" were going to be held via Zoom. Staff had to "experiment" with the "break-out room" function of Zoom to ensure that, once the Regular Open Meeting moved into a Closed Session, the Closed Session conversation couldn't be heard in the Open Session. The revised Procedure has been revised to include that the "break-out room" function in Zoom will be used if the Board has to go into a Closed Session or hold a Closed Meeting.

This Procedure also includes what happens if there's a Declaration of Interest and the Member has to "leave the meeting".

The revised version is attached with the change highlighted in yellow.

The Board is requested to review the revised Procedures for content and any questions they have or any clarification they require for discussion at the November 28 meeting.

While these Procedures are actually "revised", I have not changed the "Date Last Revised" or the "New Review Date" so that the "initial" set of Rules and Procedures are all consistent.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

There are no anticipated costs associated with the implementation of these Procedures. However, if a complaint is received or the Board is involved in an investigation, costs could be incurred, e.g. legal, etc.

<u>NOTE:</u> This Procedure provides a summary of the complaint process for various matters. Reference should be made to the *Community and Policing Act* for full details of the process, investigation, actions and consequences.

#### 1.0 Definitions of Terms Used in This Procedure

- 1.1 **Board** means the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board.
- 1.2 **Board Member/s** means Member(s) of the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board

- 1.3 **Chief of Police** means (per *CSPA*, Sec. 2(1): a chief of police of a police service maintained by a police service board (a Municipal Police Service) or the Commissioner (the Commissioner of the Ontario Provincial Police). (Note: "Chief of Police" is not the same as an OPP "Detachment Commander".)
- 1.4 **Commissioner** means (per *CSPA*, Sec. 2(1): the Commissioner of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) appointed under Subsection 56(1) of the *CSPA*, and includes an acting Commissioner.
- 1.5 **Misconduct** means (per *CSPA*, Sec. 2(1):
  - (a) in the case of a police officer or special constable, misconduct as set out in Section 195;
  - (b) in the case of a member of a police service board, an O.P.P. detachment board or a First Nation O.P.P. board, a failure to comply with the applicable prescribed code of conduct; or
  - (c) in the case of a peace officer in the Legislative Protective Service, a failure to comply with the applicable rules of conduct.

Note: "Misconduct" does not mean a Board Member's or a member of the public's dislike of an action taken or vote cast by a Board Member or a decision of the Board, unless there's a contravention of the Code of Conduct.

- 1.6 **OPP Commissioner** see "Commissioner" above, Section 1.4.
- 1.7 **Police Officer** means (per *CSPA*, Sec. 2(1): a member of a police service who is appointed as a police officer or a person who is appointed as a police officer under the *Interprovincial Policing Act, 2009* and, for greater certainty, does not include a special constable, a First Nation Officer, a municipal by-law enforcement officer, a police cadet or an auxiliary member of a police service.
- 1.8 **Police Service** means (per *CSPA*, Sec. 2(1): the Ontario Provincial Police or a police service maintained by a police service board.

### 2.0 "Complaints Agencies"

The Community Safety and Policing Act provides for two "complaints agencies": the Inspectorate of Policing (IOP)/Inspector General and the Law Enforcement Complaints Agency (LECA)/Complaints Director. Brief descriptions of each follow below.

#### 2.1 Inspectorate of Policing/Inspector General

2.1.1 The Inspectorate of Policing (IOP) is a new policing oversight body under the CSPA. The Inspector General (IG) is supported by the IOP and is responsible for ensuring policing is delivered adequately and effectively across Ontario and that

Police Service Boards (PSB) and Board Members and OPP Detachment Boards (DB) and Board Members comply with their Codes of Conduct. The IG exercises independent compliance oversight focused on ensuring police services, Boards and Board Members, and Special Constable Employers (see Sec. 92, CSPA) comply with requirements under the CSPA for policing and police governance.

- 2.1.2 Under the *Act*, the IG is responsible for:
  - Assessing and monitoring Boards and Board Members, and investigating, if deemed necessary, and responding to public complaints concerning adequate and effective police service delivery and allegations of Board or Board Member misconduct;
  - Examining the performance of police services and Boards through independent inspections, investigations, monitoring and advising;
  - Identifying effective performance and, where improvements are needed, using enforcement tools, including conducting inspections, providing advice and support to policing entities, issuing directions and imposing measures to ensure compliance with the CSPA and its Regulations;
  - Imposing measures to ensure the provision of adequate and effective policing or in cases of a policing emergency;
  - Conducting data analysis and research to promote evidence-based actions and improvements; and
  - Publicly reporting on the activities of the IG, including publishing all inspection reports and an Annual Report.
- 2.1.3 Further information can be obtained from the Inspectorate of Policing website at: <a href="https://www.iopontario.ca">www.iopontario.ca</a>.
- 2.1.4 Members of the public can file complaints with the IG concerning adequate and effective police service delivery, or allegations of Board Member misconduct through the IG website <a href="www.iopontario.ca">www.iopontario.ca</a> as set out further in this Procedure.

### 2.2 Law Enforcement Complaints Agency (LECA) and the Complaints Director

- 2.2.1 The Complaints Director is the head of the Law Enforcement Complaints Agency (LECA), which is an arms-length agency of the Ontario Ministry of the Attorney General. The Agency's goal is to support the Complaints Director to provide an independent, effective, transparent and accessible public complaints system that is fair to both the public and the police, and builds confidence in the public complaint process.
- 2.2.2 The Complaints Director is a position created by the CSPA and has a mandate to
  - deal with public complaints about sworn police officers in Ontario including municipal, regional and provincial (OPP) police officers, as well as Special

- Constables of Niagara Parks Commission and Peace Officers of the Legislative Protective Service;
- implement programs and services to assist members of the public in making complaints;
- publish statistical reports for the purpose of informing the evaluation, management and improvement of policing in Ontario and the management of public complaints under Part X of the CSPA; and
- examine and review issues of a systemic nature.
- 2.2.3 The focus of the Complaints Director is not on the conduct of Detachment Board Members but rather the conduct of police officers.

For the most part, the Detachment Board will be directly involved with Items 1-5 if any complaints are received locally about those issues. With regard to Items 6 and 7, the Board might only be involved if there's an investigation regarding a complaint about one of these matters.

- 3.1 <u>Complaint By a Detachment Board Member or Member of the Public About the Detachment Board or Board Member Alleged Misconduct (Sec. 17 of O.Reg. 409/23 (Code of Conduct for Detachment Board Members) and Sec. 106 of the *CSPA*)</u>
- 3.1.1 Ontario Regulation (O.Reg.) 409/23 sets out the Code of Conduct with which every Detachment Board Member must comply, and includes certain new requirements with respect to how misconduct and conflicts of interest of Board Members must be handled. This Procedure only deals with misconduct. For the Procedure on conflicts of interest, please see the "Conflict of Interest" Procedure in "The Board" Section.
- 3.1.2 Sec. 17 of O.Reg. 409/23 requires that a Board Member disclose any conduct of another Member of the Board that the Member reasonably believes constitutes misconduct. That disclosure must be made:
  - if about another Member, to the Chair of the Board, who then notifies the IG pursuant to CSPA, Sec. 108 (Forwarding of Complaints) as outlined below; or
  - if the misconduct involves the Chair of the Board, to the IG.
- 3.1.3 A disclosure of misconduct from a Board Member to a Board Chair under Sec. 17 of the Regulation amounts to a complaint under Sec. 106 of the *Act.* Therefore, a Board Chair who receives a disclosure of misconduct under Sec. 17 of the

Regulation must forward that information to the IG in compliance with Sec. 108 of the *Act*.

- 3.1.4 Sec. 108(1) of the *Act* requires that entities and persons, including Boards and Board Members, forward to the IG any complaints made to them in relation to Sec. 106(1) (complaints about a Board Member or a Board) or Sec. 107(1) (complaints about Detachment Board Local Policies; Adequate and Effective Policing; Noncompliance with the Act by Detachment Boards; and Procedures of a Chief of Police or the OPP Commissioner) of the *Act*.
- 3.1.5 If the Board Chair becomes aware of potential misconduct of a Board Member, the following procedure to forward the complaint to the IG shall be followed:
  - 1. The information received by the Board Chair shall be forwarded to the Board Administrator.
  - 2. The Administrator shall follow up with the Complainant to obtain the complaint in writing (see Items 4a and 4b below), if not already provided. Complaints must include the name of the Complainant; otherwise, it will not be processed. Neither the Board nor the IG will accept anonymous complaints.
  - 3. The Administrator shall prepare a **notification letter** to the Complainant advising them of the Chair's legislative responsibility to forward the complaint to the IG.
    - a. The **notification letter** shall include the following information about the role of the Inspector General:

The Inspector General of Policing is responsible for receiving and addressing complaints about compliance with Ontario's Community Safety and Policing Act and its associated regulations by police services, Detachment Boards, police service boards, and organizations employing special constables. This encompasses complaints regarding the provision of adequate and effective policing and the conduct of Detachment Board Members. Besides addressing public complaints, the Inspector General also accepts disclosures of misconduct from Members of police services and special constables. For more information, please visit <a href="https://www.IOPontario.ca">www.IOPontario.ca</a>.

- 4. While Sec. 108 does not dictate the form a complaint must take, if the complaint information has been provided:
  - a. **In writing**: forward written complaint to the IG via email at <a href="mailto:lOPComplaints@Ontario.ca">lOPComplaints@Ontario.ca</a>.
  - b. **Verbally**: ask the Complainant to put the complaint in writing The Complainant shall include the following information:

- Who is the complaint about?
- What is the complaint about? What is the alleged misconduct?
- Who was involved?
- Where did the incident occur?
- When did the incident occur?
- Any other relevant information.
- Any supporting materials or documents related to the complaint.
- The Complainant's name, address (mailing and street), phone number, email address, and signature.

The complaint and all materials/documents shall be forwarded to the IG via email at <a href="mailto:loca">loca</a> ontario.ca</a>, with a cover letter listing the supporting materials/documents, and a copy of the **notification letter** that was sent to the Complainant.

- 3.1.6 After a complaint has been submitted to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing, the IG shall follow the process set out in Sections 106(2) 106(7) of the *Act* and any other applicable sections.
- 3.1A Complaint By a Detachment Board Member or Member of the Public About the Chair of the Detachment Board Alleged Misconduct (Sec. 17 of O.Reg. 409/23 (Code of Conduct for Detachment Board Members) and Sec. 106 of the CSPA)
- 3.1A.1 A complaint by a Detachment Board Member or a member of the public about Detachment Board Chair alleged misconduct shall be submitted by the Complainant directly to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing either:
  - via its online complaint form at: <a href="https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint">https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint;</a>
     or
  - via email or mail by downloading a Complaint Form also available at: <a href="https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint">https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint</a>.
- 3.1A.2 After a complaint has been submitted to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing, the IG shall follow the process set out in Sections 106(2) 106(7) of the *Act* and any other applicable sections.
- 3.2 Complaint By a Detachment Board Member or Member of the Public About Detachment Board Alleged Misconduct (Sec. 17 of O.Reg. 409/23 (Code of Conduct for Detachment Board Members) and Sec. 106 of the CSPA)
- 3.2.1 A complaint by a Detachment Board Member or a member of the public about Detachment Board alleged misconduct shall be submitted by the Complainant directly to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing either:

- via its online complaint form at: <a href="https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint">https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint</a>; or

- 3.2.2 After a complaint has been submitted to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing, the IG shall follow the process set out in Sections 106(2) 106(7) of the *Act* and any other applicable sections.
- 3.3 <u>Complaint By a Member of the Public About a Detachment Board Local Policy(ies) (Sec. 107(1)(c) of the CSPA)</u>
- 3.3.1 A complaint by a member of the public about a Detachment Board Local Policy(ies) shall be submitted by the Complainant directly to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing either:
  - via its online complaint form at: <a href="https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint">https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint</a>; or
  - via email or mail by downloading a Complaint Form also available at: https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint.
- 3.3.2 After a complaint has been submitted to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing, the IG shall follow the process set out in Sections 107(2) 107(10) of the *Act* and any other applicable sections.
- 3.4 Complaint By a Member of the Public About Adequate and Effective Policing (Sec. 107(1)(a) of the CSPA)
- 3.4.1 A complaint by a member of the public about adequate or effective policing shall be submitted by the Complainant directly to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing either:
  - via its online complaint form at: <a href="https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint">https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint</a>; or
  - via email or mail by downloading a Complaint Form also available at: https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint.
- 3.4.2 After a complaint has been submitted to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing, the IG shall follow the process set out in Sections 107(2) 107(10) of the *Act* and any other applicable sections.
- 3.5 Complaint By a Member of the Public About Non-Compliance With the Act by a Detachment Board (Sec. 107(1)(b) of the CSPA)

- 3.5.1 A complaint by a member of the public about non-compliance with the *Act* by a Detachment Board shall be submitted by the Complainant directly to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing either:
  - via its online complaint form at: https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint; or
  - via email or mail by downloading a Complaint Form also available at: https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint.
- 3.5.2 After a complaint has been submitted to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing, the IG shall follow the process set out in Sections 107(2) 10710) of the *Act* and any other applicable sections.
- 3.6 Complaint By a Member of the Public About Procedures of a Chief of Police* or the OPP Commissioner (Sec. 107(1)(d) of the CSPA)
- 3.6.1 A complaint by a member of the public about the Procedures of a Chief of Police* or the OPP Commissioner shall be submitted by the Complainant directly to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing either:
  - via its online complaint form at: <a href="https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint">https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint</a>; or
  - via email or mail by downloading a Complaint Form also available at: <a href="https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint">https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint</a>.

*NOTE: A "Chief of Police" is not an OPP Detachment Commander. See Definition in Section 1.3 of this Procedure.

- 3.6.2 After a complaint has been submitted to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing, the IG shall follow the process set out in Sections 107(2) 10710) of the *Act* and any other applicable sections.
- 3.6.3 If the Detachment Board receives a complaint about the procedures of a Chief of Police that should have been made to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing, it shall forward the complaint to the IG/Inspectorate of Policing as set out in Section 3.6.1 herein, inform the person who made the complaint that the complaint has been forwarded, and provide the person with information about the role of the IG/Inspectorate of Policing as set out in Section 3.1.5(3)(a) of this Procedure.
- 3.6.4 As noted in Section 3.0 herein, the Board is not directly involved in complaints about the procedures of a Chief of Police and might only be involved if there's an investigation into the matter.

# 3.7 <u>Complaint By a Member of the Public About a Police Officer (Sec. 154 of the CSPA)</u>

- 3.7.1 A complaint by a member of the public about a police officer shall be submitted by the Complainant directly to the Law Enforcement Complaints Agency (LECA) either:
  - via its online complaint form at: <a href="https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint">https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint</a>; or
  - via email or mail by downloading a Complaint Form also available at: https://www.iopontario.ca/en/complaints/make-or-manage-a-complaint.
- 3.7.2 After a complaint has been submitted to LECA, the Complaints Director shall follow the process set out in Sections 157-181 of the Act and any other applicable sections.
- 3.7.3 If the Detachment Board receives a complaint about police officer conduct that should have been made to the Complaints Director, it shall forward the complaint to the Complaints Director, inform the person who made the complaint that the complaint has been forwarded, and provide the person with information about the role of the Complaints Director as set out in Sections 2.2.1, 2.2.2 and 2.2.3 of this Procedure.
- 3.7.4 As noted in Section 3.0 herein, the Board is not directly involved in complaints about a police officer and might only be involved if there's an investigation into the matter.
- 3.8 Complaints By the Minister (Sec. 109 of the CSPA)
- 3.8.1 The Minister may make a complaint under Sec. 106 or 107.
- 3.8.2 If the Minister makes a complaint under Sec. 106 or 107, the IG may decline to act on it and shall provide the Minister with written reasons for that decision.

#### A. <u>DISCLOSURE OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST</u>

#### 1.0 **Definitions**

- 1.1 "Conflict of interest" means a situation in which a member of an OPP Detachment Board's private interests or personal relationships place, or may reasonably be perceived to place, the Member in conflict with their duties as a Member of the O.P.P. Detachment Board. (CSPA, O.Reg. 409/23, Sec. 2)
- 1.2 "Personal relationship" includes, but is not limited to, a relationship with any of the following persons:
  - a. A current or former spouse or common-law partner of the board member.
  - b. A current or former intimate partner of the board member.
  - c. The board member's children, including biological and adoptive children and stepchildren.
  - d. The legal dependents of the board member.
  - e. A child in the board member's care.
  - f. The board member's grandparents, parents or siblings, including grandparents-in-law, parents-in-law and siblings-in-law. (CSPA, O.Reg. 409/23, Sec. 2)

#### 2.0 Declaration/Disclosure of Interest

- 2.1 A Member of the Detachment Board shall promptly disclose any conflict of interest
  - a. to the Chair of the Board*; or
  - b. if the conflict of interest involves the Chair, to the Inspector General (IG)**. (CSPA, O.Reg. 409/23, Sec. 20(1)(a) and (b))
  - *2.1.1 The Member shall make the disclosure to the Chair on the Declaration of Interest Form attached to this Procedure.
  - **2.1.2The Chair may use the Declaration of Interest form attached to this Procedure to make the disclosure to the IG. Disclosures of conflict of interest that are required to be sent to the Inspector General should be emailed to <a href="mailto:IOPnotifications@Ontario.ca">IOPnotifications@Ontario.ca</a>, with a copy to the Board's Police Services Advisor, Tom Gervais, at <a href="mailto:tom.gervais@ontario.ca">tom.gervais@ontario.ca</a> (current as of August 29, 2024).
- 2.2 After making the disclosure required by Section 2.1 herein, the Member shall disclose the conflict at the next meeting of the Board. (CSPA, O.Reg. 409/23, Sec. 20(2))
- 2.3 In addition to making the disclosure required by Sections 2.1 and 2.2 herein, the Member shall follow the procedure set out in Sections 2.4 2.7 herein.
- 2.4 Prior to a particular matter being addressed at a Board meeting, a Member shall declare any conflicts of interest they may have, and the general nature thereof, in connection with that matter pursuant to the Code of Conduct. Such declarations shall be recorded in the Minutes.
- 2.5 A Member shall provide to the Recording Secretary a written Declaration of Interest statement of the Member's interest(s). The statement must include a description of the general nature of the interest(s) and a reference to the agenda item or items to which the statement relates. See Declaration of Interest Form attached to this Procedure.
- 2.6 A Member who declares interest shall not take part in any discussion of or vote on any question in respect of the matter and must not attempt in any way to influence the voting on any such matter either before, during or after the meeting. The Member must leave the meeting for that part of the meeting during which that matter is under consideration.
  - 2.6.1 For the purposes of virtual meetings, and when a Member has declared Conflict of Interest, the Member shall "leave the meeting" by **completely disconnecting from the meeting**. See Section 1.6.2 of the "Meetings Virtual

#### Meetings" Procedure for the full procedure.

- 2.7 Where the interest of a Member has not been disclosed by reason of the Member's absence from the meeting(s) at which the matter was discussed, the Member shall disclose the interest and otherwise comply at the first meeting attended by the Member after the meeting(s) at which the item was discussed.
- 2.8 The Recording Secretary shall maintain a file of Declarations submitted by Members.
- B. <u>DISCLOSURE OF MISCONDUCT</u> Section 17 of O.Reg. 409/23 of the <u>Community Safety and Policing Act – Code of Conduct for Detachment Board Members</u>

NOTE: This section relates to disclosure by another Board Member of a Board Member's or the Chair's alleged misconduct. Such disclosure shall be considered to be a complaint made under Section 106(1) of the CSPA and processed the same as a complaint made under that Section. See the "Complaints" Procedure in the "Administration" section of these Rules and Procedures for the full procedures and process.

#### 1.0 Definitions

#### "Misconduct" means

- (a) in the case of a police officer or special constable, misconduct as set out in Section 195:
- (b) in the case of a member of a police service board, an O.P.P. detachment board or a First Nation O.P.P. board, a failure to comply with the applicable prescribed code of conduct, or
- (c) in the case of a peace officer in the Legislative Protective Service, a failure to comply with the applicable rules of conduct. (CSPA, Section 2(1))

"Misconduct" does not mean a Board Member's dislike of an action taken or vote cast by another Member, unless there's a contravention of the Code of Conduct.

#### 2.0 Disclosure of Misconduct

- 2.1 Section 17 of O.Reg. 409/23 (Code of Conduct for OPP Detachment Board Members) requires that a Board Member disclose any conduct of another Member of the Board that the Member reasonably believes constitutes misconduct:
  - a. to the Chair of the Board, who shall then notify the Inspector General (IG) pursuant to CSPA Section 108 as outlined herein; or

- b. to the IG, if the misconduct involves the Chair.
- 2.2 A report by a Board Member under Section 17 of O.Reg. 409/23 to the Board Chair of alleged misconduct of <u>another</u> Board Member, amounts to a "complaint" made under Section 106 of the *Act* (Complaints About Boards/Board Members by the Public). Therefore, if the Board Chair receives a Disclosure of Misconduct under Section 17 of O.Reg. 409.23, they must follow the process as set out in the *Act* starting with Section 106(1).
  - See the "Complaints" Procedure in the "Administration" section of these Rules and Procedures for the full procedures and process.
- 2.3 A report by a Board Member under Section 17 of O.Reg. 409/23 of alleged misconduct by the Board Chair, amounts to a "complaint" made under Section 106 of the *Act* (Complaints About Boards/Board Members by the Public). Such disclosure shall be made to the Inspector General and the Board Member must follow the process as set out in the *Act* starting with Section 106(1).
  - See the "Complaints" Procedure in the "Administration" section of these Rules and Procedures for the full procedures and process.

### 1.0 <u>Virtual Meetings</u>

- 1.1 Due to the distance between Pickle Lake and Sioux Lookout (approximately 270km), it is not practical, time-efficient or cost-effective to hold "in-person" meetings on a regular basis. Therefore, the Board shall conduct Regular or Special Meetings, Open or Closed, virtually.
  - 1.1.1 Virtual Meeting -- A virtual meeting allows for people in different physical locations to use their mobile or internet connected devices to meet in the same "virtual room". Attendees join the meeting via a virtual meeting platform, such as Microsoft Teams or Zoom, as determined by the Board Administrator.
- 1.2 Virtual meetings are subject to the provisions of these Rules and Procedures including proper notice of the meeting, distribution and posting of the agenda, attendance (regrets, absences), the Rules of Debate, decorum, etc.
- 1.3 If technology is available and if authorized by the Board, by motion, the Municipality of Sioux Lookout and the Township of Pickle Lake may alternate "hosting" virtual meetings; otherwise, the Municipality of Sioux Lookout will host all meetings.
- 1.4 Members may participate by means of video-enabled conference telephone, electronic devices, or other communications devices as available.
- 1.5 A quorum (3) of the Board must participate in a virtual meeting in order for a meeting to proceed.
- 1.6 Members shall be required to be present for the duration of the meeting, with their cameras turned on and situated in a venue that is conducive to meeting expectations (e.g. privacy, confidentiality, etc.). Should a Member be required to

leave the meeting for any reason*, permission shall be sought from the Chair*, and the Member shall be excused (see 1.6.1 below), at which time the Member shall turn their audio and video off. The Member shall announce her/his return to the meeting by turning on his/her audio and video and advising the Chair that s/he has returned to the meeting*. The departure and return times shall be noted in the Minutes.

- 1.6.1 If quorum is lost as a result of the Member being excused, the meeting shall be deemed to be adjourned.*
- *1.6.2 In the case of a declared Conflict of Interest wherein a Member is required to leave a meeting, permission of the Chair is not required. When the Member leaves a meeting because of a declared Conflict of Interest, s/he shall **completely disconnect from the meeting**. Once the Board concludes the discussion/decision on the subject matter specified in the Declaration, the Member shall be contacted (by the Administrator or the Recording Secretary) either by email or phone and advised that s/he may reconnect/sign into to the meeting. A Member leaving a meeting due to a declared Conflict of Interest does not result in a loss of quorum.
- 1.7 Should the connection for electronic participation be lost or interrupted, the meeting shall continue and the affected Member's time of departure from the meeting will be noted in the Minutes.
  - 1.7.1 If quorum is lost as a result of disconnected or interrupted connection, the Board shall wait five minutes while the Member tries to rectify the situation. If the Member is unable to reconnect, the meeting shall be deemed to be adjourned.
- 1.8 For the purposes of voting, Members present at a virtual meeting shall ensure that their intentions are clear and understood, i.e. verbalizing their vote and raising their hand, pursuant to the direction from the Chair.

## 2.0 Posting Notice, Agendas, Web-links, etc.

For virtual meetings, the web link, phone number or other electronic connection information to access the meetings will be published on the Board's webpage and on the meeting Agenda. Should circumstances exist that the Board's webpage is not available, notice shall be provided in a manner that will provide access to the largest number of members of the public possible in the circumstances.

#### 3.0 Live-Streamed and Video-Recorded Meetings

- 3.1 Detachment Board meetings that are open to the public will be live-streamed on an appropriate internet-based platform that is generally available to the public. Should internet services not exist or be unavailable, meetings may be held by telephone conference or other available electronic means. The open portion of the meeting will be recorded and the link to the recording posted on the Board's webpage as soon as practicable.
- 3.2 For live-streamed and/or video-recorded meetings, the following shall apply:
  - 3.2.1 At the start of the meeting, the Chair shall advise all in attendance that:
    - a. the meeting is being live-streamed and video-recorded;
    - b. the opinions individuals representing a Delegation/Presentation are their own, and the Board is not responsible for Delegates'/Presenters' comments or any materials delegates choose to provide;
    - c. the link to the livestream is posted on the Agenda so that the public can view the live proceedings, which is also the link to the video recording.
  - 3.2.2 Whenever possible, the Board will advise all Delegates/Presenters in advance of the meeting that the meeting and their presentation will be live-streamed and video-recorded, and the recording posted for public viewing.
- 3.3 A recorded video of a Board meeting is not an official record of that meeting. The official record of the Board meeting shall consist solely of the Minutes approved by the Board.

#### 4.0 Closed Meetings/Sessions

- 4.1 Closed Meetings/Sessions will also be held virtually.
- 4.2 Closed Meetings will not be live-streamed.
- 4.3 For a Closed Session falling within an Open Meeting, the electronic platform "break-out room" function will be used. Specific instructions will be provided to attendees when required.

#### 5.0 Other Options for Meeting Format -- In-person and Hybrid Meetings

5.1 Notwithstanding Section 1.0 above, the Board may hold an in-person or hybrid meeting at any time, subject to a motion of the Board approved by a two-thirds majority vote and proper notice.

- 5.1.1 Hybrid Meeting -- A hybrid meeting involves a mixture of in-person and remote attendees. Remote attendees join the meeting via a virtual meeting platform, such as Microsoft Teams or Zoom. In-person attendees sit together in a dedicated meeting room.
- 5.2 In-person and/or hybrid meetings are subject to the provisions of these Rules and Procedures including proper notice of the meeting, distribution and posting of the Agenda, attendance (regrets, absences), the Rules of Debate, decorum, etc., with necessary changes.
